The Importance of Sabbath Rest

Church leaders everywhere are exhausted. Of course we are! 2020 and 2021 have brought unprecedented challenges. Nothing in seminary prepared us for how to lead in times of pandemic. This second wave of COVID spread has heaped on top of what has been over a year of constantly tacking in new directions. Just when we thought there was going to be rest after a long journey, the DELTA variant has said to churches, "Not so fast!" Constantly changing COVID protocols, upset congregants, CDC and State guidelines, way too many funerals, cancelled vacation plans, mask mandates, unresolved grief, zoom burnout, being our church's tech guru, week-to-week changes in worship planning, and no clear end in sight – it is all exhausting.

Never in my years of ministry have I seen so many leaders prone to clergy burnout, exhaustion, and borderline hopelessness. I need your help in lifting up our ministers and helping them to rediscover joy in ministry and reconnecting to God's hopeful future for us all. Please take a moment to write your minister a note of thanks. Think about sending a small gift. Or call them to express your thanks, encourage them, or ask what they can do to help in these tough times.

One of the things I feel is desperately needed is opportunities to unplug from the constant barrage of expectations and demands. What are ways your minister can most easily experience refreshment and realign themselves with the God of rest?

Sabbath observance is of the utmost importance, now more than ever. And creative approaches to Sabbath are equally as important, as resting at home may no longer cut it, especially when you have been working from home all week! For me Sabbath is sometimes getting away from home for the day, although that presents its own challenges to true rest. Often in ministry Sabbath comes in deliberate chunks, not a strict set 24 hour period.

I believe our cell phones are at the root of our problem when it comes to breaking the 4th Commandment. Walter Brueggemann said in his book Sabbath as Resistance, "Thus I have come to think that the fourth commandment on sabbath is the most difficult and most urgent of the commandments in our society, because it summons us to intent and conduct that defies the most elemental requirements of a commodity-propelled society that specializes in control and entertainment, bread and circuses ... along with anxiety and violence."

I think of all the digital devices we have, and how their intent was to draw us better together. And they can! And they have. But they have also become monsters in and of themselves, beeping and buzzing and demanding our attention all day and sometimes all night, often drawing us away from the task at hand. Brueggemann talks about multitasking in that same book, and he does not paint a very nice picture as you might expect!

I need your help. Now is a time when we need to be intentional about drawing closer to God and realigning ourselves with the God of rest. Those of us in the pew need to be cognizant of what our minister's Sabbath practices look like. We need to stop thinking that Sunday is a Sabbath for them, because Sunday is work for them and church musicians, often filled with church meetings and new pastoral care concerns and visits. (Interesting note: Sunday was a work day in early Christendom, with 1st and 2nd Century Christians gathering in the early morning down by the river to worship God, and then heading to work, as Sunday was a workday in Roman culture until very late in their existence.) Second, we need to stop calling our ministers on their Sabbath with the opening words, "I know today is your day off, but...." Third, we need to activate the Deacons during minister vacations.

Those of us who are ministers need to talk more about Sabbath practices and encourage them in our communities. We need to preach about Sabbath, and spell out our own practices and expectations of Sabbath rest. We all know pastoral emergencies happen. But if I turn off my cell phone for 12 hours or 24 hours is the sky going to fall? Perhaps there are alternative ways for people to contact us if there is an emergency. Communicating those practices are going to be increasingly important in this 24/7 world of texting and push notifications. We also need to stop treating the Sabbath as a day to catch up on chores or shopping. That fits right into that problem of our commodity-propelled society, doesn't it?

I lived in Jerusalem for a semester. I cannot tell you the power of a whole community practicing Sabbath TOGETHER. This is where the true power of Sabbath begins. What would our presbytery look like if everyone of us began Sabbath rest as the sun set on Friday and ALL of us rested together until sundown on Saturday? I guarantee I wouldn't get 400 new emails on my day off.

Celebrating the Sabbath in Jerusalem was also a powerful reminder to me that Sabbath wasn't sitting around doing nothing, but a special time to reconnect to God in prayer and community. The day was organized differently. The prayers were different. The interactions and people I encountered on Friday into Saturday were different.

I have maintained that Friday trajectory for much of my ministry. Today my Sabbath is filled with a variety of experiences. The prayer book continues to nourish that time, and often speaking the Hebrew words helps remind me of the importance of Sabbath and its roots. The dog helps me greatly, with numerous Sabbath walks in order, often down by the river in Perrysburg or across the bridge on the Maumee side. I utilize yoga, reading, tending to our plants, and often bread-making or music-making. The prayer book is essential throughout. Time visiting with friends is a majority of my Sabbath, as often I can hear God speaking more powerfully through others than through my individual prayer times. More recently I have come to realize how often I am almost too regimented and too methodical with Sabbath. Simply receiving the time as a gift can be challenging for me. I need to not force Sabbath, and let God's Sabbath come as a gift.

How can you breathe deeply into God's Shalom?

Above all, I encourage each of you to adopt Sabbath practices and stick to them, letting their rhythm and familiarity guide you over time. Returning to something familiar has power, even if the demands in ministry take you away from them one or two weeks in a row.

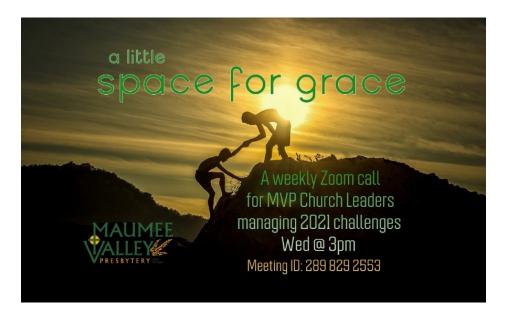
Of course we don't live in a culture that practices Sabbath. And that is another root of the problem, and our challenge in realigning ourselves with our God of Shalom and rest. But if we can come to terms with

that reality/shortcoming of our society and work around it, we too can follow the 4th Commandment (and the 10th Commandment also). Communication and expectations of one another are key. But mainly we need to get more serious about following this important command from God. Remember...

God felt so strongly about Sabbath rest, He decided to make it more than just a SUGGESTION.

3 Pastoral Searches

I celebrate with some of our churches who after a long time of searching, have discovered the next pastor that God had prepared for them. They are moving toward the final steps, like a congregational meeting, and I suspect there will be a few new COMINGS in our time of COMINGS and GOINGS at the next meeting.

Attached to my report is an Alban Institute article that recently came out, called "Searching for a Pastor is Sacred Work." The power in it are the links to some of the blogs and musings of the article.

Indeed, being a part of a PNC is a sacred calling that helps shape and nurture a church, often for quite a time to come.

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Searching for a pastor is sacred work



Clergy know the long periods of silence between contacts from a pastor search committee. Congregation members know the even-longer period between substantive reports about the activities of a search committee. The members of such committees are very, very busy — meeting weekly, reading, making calls.

Many members of the search committees I have known report that serving is one of the spiritual high points of their lives. There are some simple reasons for this. The mission of the committee is important and clear: recommend a pastor. The entire committee starts the process at the same time and finishes at the same time. Team development literature indicates that a clear, common mission and task greatly helps a group become a cohesive team. This is markedly different from the experience of serving on the typical church committee.

These mechanical aspects don't fully explain the significance of this experience. Searching for a pastor is sacred work. In most traditions, the opportunity comes to only a few, and then only once in a lifetime of faithful membership.

 My colleague Kelly Ryan completed her service on a search committee this summer. She <u>helps us consider</u> how to set up other committees' work to be meaningful.

- For many Weekly readers, the experience of talking with a search committee leads to rejection. I have been interviewed by six pastor search committees over the years and only been called by one. (I am not counting those that rejected me without ever talking to me.) It can help those on the candidate side of the table to consider what the committees really want to know. A few years ago, I realized that most of the time, congregations are discerning answers to questions like "Can this pastor love us?" and "Is this pastor competent?"
- One of the challenges about guiding a pastor search process is that the details differ significantly between denominations. In some, the new pastor is appointed with a conversation or two between a few lay leaders and the denomination. In others, the governing board members choose a pastor from a list, but don't talk to the pastor unless the candidate requests a conversation. No matter the denominational process, however, a change in pastors deserves attention. The Alban Institute was founded on insights about the dynamics of pastoral change, and wisdom about that experience has been harvested for years by interim ministry practitioners. Norman Bendroth has put together insights from practitioners in this book.

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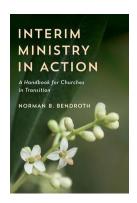

Actions Taken on Behalf of Presbytery:

Cash Salary \$ 1,750 per month

Vacation = 1 week (accruable to 4 weeks per annum, if renewed)

Chris Schilling as Parish Associate for the months of September and October 2021 as Lanie Sipes completes her parental leave. The terms are \$ 292 per week at 10 hours per week for each.

Approved partial grants of up to \$ 200 for the first 10 congregations that register for Holy Cow! CAT assessment from September 15, 2021 through the end of the year. With Holy Cow! Congregational Assessment Tool you get the added opportunity of working with Susan Rowland Miller who oversees the assessment and report to the session and congregation that follows. Our goal is to encourage congregations to use assessment tools as they plan for the future, whether or not they will be actively seeking pastoral leadership. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

Time was spent on clarifying the goals of our work together. We named these intended focuses and outcomes of our work:

- 1. As a Matthew 25 presbytery, equip leaders in MVP, especially Sessions, to address the seventh signs of a vital congregation, Ecclesiastical Health. This includes providing training and resources to help congregations clarify their mission, core values to ministry and the understanding of why they are church.
- 2. Help smaller congregations actively imagine and plan for their futures. This includes conversations regarding right-sizing, transparent and faithful stewardship of resources (financial, people and space), sharing staff or ministries with other PCUSA or non-PCUSA congregations, and best practices, when appropriate, in moving towards closing.
- 3. Encouraging all congregations to use Holy Cow's Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT) in order to provide common starting points and on-going conversations about mission and planning.
- 4. Larger goal is that every Session within the presbytery will, at any point in time, be able to articulate their sense of mission and their next steps in their journey as the body of Christ (i.e., not just consider these at the time of transition and, subsequently, be capable of immediately naming them at the time of transition).

ACTIONS TAKEN ON BEHALF OF PRESBYTERY:

- 1. Matthew 25 grants approved—Inspiration Station (\$1000 in addition to previous LatinX grant for ongoing work), Hamni (\$1000 new cross cultural ministry with Greater Grace Christian Church to provide Korean food in association with their existing food pantry) McComb (\$500 School supply drive, Defiance (\$1000) (new ministry partnership for back to school haircuts and backpack drive), Findlay First (\$1000) and (\$500 from LatinX fund) Support of Mobile Health Fairs
- 2. Two Cents a Meal distribution— \$2400 had accumulated in this fund and was distributed to food pantries throughout the Presbytery to support local food banks.
- 3. Distribution of budget funding to Kirkmont, WeCare and Toledo Campus Ministry

RECOMMENDATIONS TO PRESBYTERY:

- 1. Budget recommendations
 - a. That the Matthew 25 grant budget be increased.
 - b. That Kirkmont is doing well and support be decreased to the previous level.
 - c. That support for Toledo Campus Ministries be decreased.
 - d. That support for Emerging Latinx Ministries be increased.
 - e. That support for School Ministries of Ohio was phased out, as planned.
- 2. Consider the idea of a racial reconciliation taskforce to move us beyond study to act.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

- 1. Habitat Project –Chas Myers is working with regional leaders to help us plan hands on Presbytery wide local events for next fall.
- 2. Mobile Health Fair update –Findlay First and others are actively working on this and Jose will present at a future MVP meeting.
- 3. Trying to coordinate mission care and connection between various churches, knowing that together we can have a bigger impact.
- 4. Tap the leadership resources available (Chas in Habitat, Doug in Self Development of People, Ann Wasson in mental health initiatives (through NAMI), Ed Carlson in racial justice issues, for example) and be on the lookout for mission opportunities in our communities.
- 5. Having each commission member have a dedicated group to support. Discipleship intends to do the same—similar to the COM liaison system. This might also include encouragement for churches to evaluate memorial funds and other funding sitting in accounts that only all allow narrowly focused use.

Rev Dr Matt Meinke

Rev Dr Matt Meinke was appointed our Temporary General Presbyter in November 2018 with a view that, after three years, he could be considered to be called as our installed General Presbyter. That time has now arrived.

When he arrived, Presbytery was in the midst of radical change, scrapping our old form of government for a new, more streamlined version. Then, in the midst of all this along came COVID.

These past two years have been a very testing time for all of us and, for Matt, at the forefront, he has worked tirelessly to guide us through all these changes. Thank goodness for his boundless energy. In addition to this, and during this time, fourteen churches in our presbytery have gone through, or are still going through, a period of transition in seeking new leadership in some form or other. Matt has been closely involved with *all* these churches.

Matt has, over these past three years, shown his commitment to this presbytery and accordingly Personnel Committee is happy to recommend to presbytery, through Central Commission, that Dr Matt Meinke be called as its installed General Presbyter, to be installed, along with our other office bearers, at our November presbytery meeting.
