Rev Bova is currently working as temporary pastor at Defiance on a ¾ time basis while working ¼ time at presbytery as Administrative Consultant for Transformation. Defiance is presently seeking a new pastor, so Lynn would continue working at Defiance on a ¼ time basis, while working as the Interim Temporary Presbyter on a ¾ time basis. Once Defiance finds a new pastor and, if Lynn is still working as Interim Temporary Presbyter, she would then start working full time for the presbytery.

This contract would initially be for 3 months commencing Feb 15, 2018, being renewable on a month to month basis thereafter with 30 days' notice being required from either side.

Vice-Moderator Report for Council

January 17, 2018

It is my intention to create a worship team that will work with the host churches and their pastors in designing our presbytery worship services. The current team is: Emily Mitchell from Maumee, Jessie Myer from Findlay, and Karol Farris from Bluffton. Our plans are to work with host pastors to design worship appropriate to the stated purpose of the presbytery meeting as determined by Council.

Plans are underway for enlisting host churches for the remainder of 2018. Maumee First has offered to host the May meeting. It is my understanding that Market Street was promised a meeting this year so they will be contacted. Ideally a west, northwest, or northeast location can be added as well. Once the presbytery dates are confirmed by council, I will begin contacting other possible church options.

REPORT OF SUSAN MEIER, PRESBYTER FOR COMMON LIFE TO BRANCH OF CONGREGATIONAL LIFE

JANUARY 11, 2018

As I write this final report to the Branch of Congregational Life, I am grateful for the growth in focus for this committee over the past eight years. When I arrived here, this committee described their ministry as "not knowing what we should be doing". Their focus at the time was upon reading Session records. They had just cancelled a leadership development Saturday due to lack of attendance. They reported being demoralized

We began to discuss the opportunities they had for congregational development and support.

In 2012, The vision of the Presbytery was changed from Witnessing, Embracing, Teaching to:

- -Living as Covenant Community
- -Transforming lives and communities in the name of Jesus Christ;
- -Making Healthy Transitions;

By 2017, the Branch had accomplished the following:

- -Sponsored two events on Congregational Stewardship which were well attended by laity and clergy;
- -Developed a strong program of spiritual formation with quarterly retreats and sacred conversations, as well as a practice of leading worship at committee meetings;
- -Initiated the "Beer and Hymns" program at the Black Cloister in Toledo which has provided an informal way for members of churches and community members to gather in a fun environment and to praise God in son.
- -Developed, supported and worked towards a comprehensive partnership between two Presbyterian Churches in Toledo (Grace and Collingwood), including the writing of grants and solicitation of financial and prayer support throughout the Presbytery.
- -Financially supported participation in two campus ministry events held at Montreat Conference Center by Toledo Campus Ministry. One year included participants from other churches.
- -500th anniversary of the Reformation observances including conversations with groups with whom reform still needs to happen: Mennonite and Anabaptist conversations, White privilege and racial equality, Gay, Lesbian and Transgendered persons.
- -Developed and implemented Professional Misconduct Training and Child Protection Training each year for 3 years.

- -Supported Kirkmont Camp and Conference Center and advertised and provided scholarships for campers, including full payment for children and grandchildren of clergy and church professionals in Maumee Valley Presbytery.
- -Changed the policy regarding Sacrament Education, receiving Presbytery approval, and implementing new practice of providing access to plans for Training Elders to Administer the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Each Session decides how a PCUSA Minister of Word and Sacrament will train elders and then yearly reports those plans to the Branch of Congregational Life.
- -Provided successful grant writing which resulted in the financial support of Latino Evangelism Internship for 3 years, support for the Searchlite Congregation (a non-PCUSA congregation) sharing ministry with First Presbyterian Church of Maumee, and one year of evangelism outreach for Sandusky Presbyterian Church in Sandusky Ohio (which all involved decided did not bear fruit in Sandusky). Some mistakes are worth making.
- -Initiated and supported a new church development, Mt. Sinai New Church Development which focused upon reaching Latino people in the Norwalk, Ohio area. Three years ago, this NCD was placed under the authority of an administrative commission so that they could determine whether or not to be a commissioned congregation. They have chosen not to be commissioned and are now exploring what model of Bible Study fellowship might be their future.
- -In addition, held yearly Session Records Review.

I hope that you believe that God has blessed all your work, sometimes with fruitfulness and sometimes not. As we live into the new future to which Christ is calling us in the PCUSA, I believe that characteristics which will be required is the willingness to try new things and the desire above all to follow where Christ rightly leads. As you consider what new ministries God is calling you in 2018, pray that what has be planted will be gently protected until the time of harvest.

The proposed new vision for the Presbytery currently under discussion by all our ministry teams and congregations is:

- Covenant Community Discipleship: transforming church members into active fruitful disciples of Jesus Christ within their communities;
- 2) Transforming Lives Salt & Light (mission): as disciples, outreach to our communities and our world is the ultimate purpose for which we are called.
 Effective missional presence to the communities within which our congregations are located is essential if we are to be faithful to God's call; and

- 3) **Spiritual Leadership**: enhancing and cultivating vibrant visionary leadership within our congregations.
- 4) It was also recognized that a fourth area, **Administrative/Central Supp**ort, will be needed to perform organizational tasks such as finance/budgeting, personnel, nominations, administrative commissions, and Council (much smaller in size).

Thank you deeply for your ministries.

I am grateful for having served alongside you.







Maumee Valley Presbytery Organizational Restructuring

Tom Polker and I met on 1/12/18 to talk about next steps for the restructuring process. You have seen the summary of what has occurred to date that I prepared for the Search Committee. In that summary I commented that the design team (Tom, Lynn Bova, Susan Meier, and me) would go no further until Susan's successor has been selected. Tom suggested to me that we consider continuing to work on the model to have it better developed (but not finalized) so that the new General Presbyter could step right into the finalization and implementation of the plan. I thought this was a good idea so we met. Following is what we recommend happen next.

Overview:

- 1. MVP's work would be organized around three major work areas: Mission (Salt & Light), Leadership, and Discipleship (Covenant Community), plus a fourth for Central Support (budget, finance, personnel, etc. to support the work of MVP) which would replace the commissions and committees that presently exist. Briefly explained, the focus of each of the three areas would be to assist local congregations in these areas:
 - Mission carry out the work of the church within the communities in which
 congregations are located and to strengthen our interconnectedness with other
 churches within MVP (and beyond) for broader mission work. Become a core
 part of our communities through our outreach and missionary work.
 - Leadership prepare local leaders (Session members and others likely to provide local leadership) to provide leadership to their congregations. Together with the local pastor, these individuals would provide guidance and inspiration to their congregations to accomplish the mission outreach that they identify.
 - Discipleship prepare members of local congregations to understand our
 Presbyterian identity and respond positively to the call to mission.

Mission, Leadership, and Discipleship are intricately linked and interconnected: 1) Local congregational members are identified and prepared to envision and plan the work of the congregation (Leadership); 2) they engage members of the congregation who embrace the concepts of mission and covenant community (Discipleship); 3) to

carry out the call to mission within their communities (Mission). The three exist as a circle, with each area connected to and reliant on the others. Through this organizational model, the role of MVP would be to support and assist local churches in their development in these three areas.

Next Steps:

- 2. During the second meeting with the group of younger ministers and some Session members from their churches, this group reviewed the work of Council to assign all work presently being done by MVP to one of the three areas. They then identified three main tasks for each of the areas. These now need to be further developed along with a plan for how this work would be done.
- 3. We propose creation of a task force to carry on the work begun by the initial design team. We think that 5 7 people would be sufficient. We think it would be good to include several of the younger ministers who participated in the earlier meetings, Dean McGormley, if he is able to do so, and one or two elders with experience in organizational transformation. Tom and I would also like to serve on this task force.
- 4. The task force would have the following purpose:
 - Flesh out the three tasks already identified to develop a clear purpose for each
 of the three Work Areas engage members of MVP (likely at the May MVP
 meeting) in this process. Identify what the Work Areas will be called (e.g.
 Platform, Work Area, something else).
 - Recommend how the three Work Areas would be organized (number of members, where they come from, how they are identified and selected, etc.), and the possible (likely) use of work groups to work on specific tasks that are identified within the overall mission of the Work Area (and how these work groups would be created). Generally, give thought to and make recommendations about how the Work Area Team would do its work.
 - Recommend a transition process to be implemented to move from our current structure and process to the new structure (could be all at once or sequentially).

- Recommend general support that each of the three Work Areas would need from MVP via the Central Support Team.
- Keep everyone informed about their work and seek input as they go forward.
 Also, task force members would be expected to identify any assistance or resources they need to do their work.
- 5. Identify the members to serve on this task force. Do those we identify need to be approved by Council or, with Council's suggestions, can we just recruit these members and get started?

We believe the work of this proposed task force would move us beyond the conceptual phase, which has been approved by MVP, to a more concrete model for the future organization of MVP.

Maumee Valley Presbytery Organizational Restructuring

How the discussion began:

During a Council meeting in early 2017 Tom Polker voiced a concern about the need for developing greater leadership among lay members of individual congregations. Tom was speaking (I believe) from a spiritual perspective regarding the need to strengthen the capacity of local congregations to become more engaged in their communities to carry out the work of God in whatever ways possible. As I recall, Tom was speaking to the need for greater spiritual leadership coming from members of local congregations rather than only from clergy.

The idea of strengthening local leadership had practical implications, as well. Susan Meier spoke to the changing demographics of MVP, specifically the decrease in number of congregations and total membership and the substantial decrease in the number of ordained clergy serving these churches. She later prepared a PowerPoint presentation showing these changes over the past 10 years. The current demographic composition of MVP does not support the organizational model that MVP has used for many years. The concept of enhancing local leadership for spiritual purposes therefore had positive organizational implications, as well.

What occurred next:

A task force was formed to develop a concept for a new structure for MVP. That task force, comprised of Lynn Bova, Tom Polker, Jay Salvage, and Susan Meier met several times and talked about the mission and purpose of MVP; and determined that Presbytery's key role is to support and enhance the ability of congregations within the Presbytery to carry out their work within their communities and in their connection with other congregations in MVP. The focus of the discussion among task force members settled on three main areas in which MVP could support local congregations: 1) Covenant Community – Discipleship: transforming church members into active fruitful disciples of Jesus Christ within their communities; 2) Transforming Lives – Salt & Light (mission): as disciples, outreach to our communities and our world is the

ultimate purpose for which we are called. Effective missional presence to the communities within which our congregations are located is essential if we are to be faithful to God's call; and 3) **Spiritual Leadership**: enhancing and cultivating vibrant visionary leadership within our congregations. It was also recognized that a fourth area, Administrative/Central Support, will be needed to perform organizational tasks such as finance/budgeting, personnel, nominations, administrative commissions, and Council (much smaller in size).

Task Force members next asked a group of "younger" ministers of churches within MVP to review our work and meet with us to discuss the concept we had developed. An excellent discussion with this group resulted in affirmation of the concept and further development of the three main areas around which the work of MVP would be structured. This group agreed that the primary role of Presbytery is to support the work of local congregations in their work in these three areas by developing and providing resources, models, connections, etc. to assist local congregations, rather than to do work that is separate from or not connected to that of our member churches.

Next, Council members spent an evening reviewing all of the tasks and work presently being done by MVP committees and assigning each of these to one of the four areas of work (including Administrative/Central Support). Following that meeting, the group of "younger" ministers, augmented by several Session members from their congregations, reviewed the work done by Council and identified three main areas of work for each of the three areas of organization. This is all presented on the attached organizational chart.

Finally this concept and model was presented to MVP members in November, 2017. MVP members were asked for input and reaction, both at that time and in written form following the meeting. While there was some expansion of the ideas expressed and several process and timing questions raised, there was widespread support for the concept and no hesitation expressed about changing our structure in this way.

Which brings us to the present:

On 12/8/17, the task force met again to discuss next steps. It was decided that the work of the task force is essentially done. We will prepare a response to the questions submitted by MVP members following the November Presbytery meeting, and we acknowledge that there is much work yet to be done to bring this organizational concept to life. We talked about the possibility of having three breakout groups (one for each of the main areas of work) at the February Presbytery meeting and inviting people to attend the one in which they have greatest interest. During those meetings we would brainstorm ideas (and examples) for the work/activities of each of the Work Areas, discuss rough budgetary needs, identify people who might want to work in each of the Areas, and discuss how to bring this discussion into local congregations.

Beyond that, however, we recognize that the person who is selected to be our next Presbyter will need to be vitally involved in the development and implementation of this concept — and will surely have ideas of his or her own, so we thought it best not to go much further until that person is selected.

Personnel Committee

Dec 12, 2017 and Jan 9, 2018

Approved a motion to ask Council to recommend to presbytery the re-election of Rev Dean McGormley as Stated Clerk of Presbytery for a further 3 years, commencing Jan 1, 2018, at the existing remuneration of \$6,667.20 per annum.

Approved a motion to request Council to approve the appointment of Rev Lynette Bova to be Interim Temporary Presbyter on the retirement of Rev Susan Meier, but commencing on Feb 15, 2018, to allow Rev Bova to work with Rev Meier for the final two weeks of February.

Rev Bova is currently working as temporary pastor at Defiance on a ¾ time basis while working ¼ time at presbytery as Administrative Consultant for Transformation. Defiance is presently seeking a new pastor, so Lynn would continue working at Defiance on a ¼ time basis, while working as the Interim Temporary Presbyter on a ¾ time basis. Once Defiance finds a new pastor and, if Lynn is still working as Interim Temporary Presbyter, she would then start working full time for the presbytery.

This contract would initially be for 3 months commencing Feb 15, 2018, being renewable on a month to month basis thereafter with 30 days' notice being required from either side.

Lynn would no longer work Administrative Consultant for Transformation. Rev Barry Murr, who has assisted Lynn on a voluntary basis in this work, will "pick up any slack" initially. Personnel Committee will look at this situation at the beginning of April.

Susan Meier's retirement celebration is being held during the presbytery meeting in February. We are seeking permission to use up to \$500 from Council's budget to meet any costs that may arise from this. What happens if the presbytery meeting is cancelled because of weather?

Personnel Committee allowed Belinda King to work some extra hours over the past month to get the filing at presbytery office up to date. This has now been completed. Filing will now be kept up to date as it comes in.

Belinda was hired, part time, as our <u>Financial Administrator</u>. We need to be clear as to how this affects the work previously carried out by Beth Wenner.

Grand Rapids Commission Report to Presbytery January 2018

The Grand Rapids Commission has continued to meet over the course of the last year. When the former session members abandoned their positions as elders in the PC(USA) the Administrative Commission took jurisdiction of the session. Since then we have:

- Offered pastoral care and worship opportunities to the members of the PCUSA congregation
- Clarified questions regarding membership to the Grand Rapids congregational members.
- Transferred membership where appropriate
- Communicated with the Clerk of the Great Lakes Presbytery, ECO about the status of the Grand Rapids congregation
- Communicated with the ECO congregation about communications we had with the Clerk of the Great Lakes Presbytery, ECO
- Communicated with the ECO congregation about the opportunity that still exists to resolve this dispute

The commission/session continues to address the spiritual hurt of the PCUSA faithful, and to work with other leaders towards resolution of the ongoing damage to the body of Christ that occurs when dismissals do not happen in an orderly fashion.

Here are some of the ideas so far -

- Inviting one or two young adult leaders, or potential leaders, from each presbytery to attend a special part of Covenant Gathering – the presbyteries would nominate the invitees
- Presbyteries, local congregations and Covenant Gathering sharing in the expenses for each attendee – a total of approximately \$400 for each attendee
- Housing the attendees together in a "common" cabin (males and females separated) instead of the normal individual or double rooms in the lodge
- The Young Adult Leadership "forum?" would meet as a group in the mornings (when other CG participants are in adult workshops or children's classes, or at another time of their choosing) and then be a part of the normal daily activities which include recreation, swimming, short interest groups, worship, community time, crafts
- Covenant Gathering would provide the leadership staff although suggestions would be very welcome
- Perhaps this effort could help to create a young adult ministry network in the two synods
