

General Assembly Commissioner Application 226th PC(USA) General Assembly

At its November 14, 2023 Stated Meeting, Maumee Valley Presbytery will elect one (1) clergy commissioner and one (1) elder commissioner to attend the upcoming 226th General Assembly in Salt Lake City, Utah. An alternate commissioner for each category will also be elected. *Young Adult Advisory Delegates are also being sought.*

- 1. Assembly committee meetings will be June 25-27, 2024, and will be conducted online using Zoom and PC-Biz (the online platform for assembly business);
- 2. Plenary business meetings will be June 29-July 4, 2024, and will be held in person at the Salt Palace Convention Center in Salt Lake City, Utah.

The MVP Nominating Committee is currently receiving applications from clergy and ruling elders within the Presbytery who are interested in serving as a General Assembly commissioner. If you wish to serve, please complete this two-page application and submit it (along with any additional materials) via email to info@maumeevp.org no later than 11:59PM November 1, 2023. Before submitting an application, please go to https://ga-pcusa.org/ and review the information for 2024. The following will be considered:

- ✓ Evidence of strong technology and computer skills since using Zoom and PC-Biz is necessary.
- ✓ Past service to the presbytery and its congregations.
- ✓ Commitment to continued service to the presbytery and its congregations including reporting to Presbytery and to meeting with congregations/sessions upon request after the General Assembly.
- ✓ Diversity and geographic distribution concerns within the presbytery.
- ✓ Preference will be given to applicants from different congregations in successive General Assemblies.
- ✓ Preference will be given to the most recent alternates should they be willing and available to serve.
